3 things in common

Acts 3 healing of lame man

Peter seeks the man out → didn't ask for healing

Some message as on Pentecost → you killed Christ

Bears witness that the
scriptures testify of Christ

Ch. 4
arrested
Sadducees upset about them
teaching resurrection

Ps. 118:22

stone the builders refused

Ps. 2:2

they celebrate with "why did the
heathen imagine vain things"

v. 16 > notable miracle we cannot
deny

Acts 4 (cont.)

when they return from the trial, they have an even greater outpouring of the Spirit than on Pentecost. → House was shaken reemphasized all things in common
→ this was not a commandment, except to love one another

Acts 5

Ananias & Saphire
gave gracious beautiful ↔ Acts 3 the gate of the temple called Beautiful

2 Kings 5:26 Gehazi gets a reward
'wont not my heart with thee?'

everyone was healed. Even Peter's shadow healed them

v. 17 they hated that they were healing people

- put in prison first time, angels miraculously release - go straight to temple to preach what they were imprisoned for
- cosy to find when the trial comes

v. 33-40 Casmuel: v. 38-39 if it is of God you can't withstand it

they agreed to this. (The fact that they were willing to accept his "if" shows they weren't certain. Yet they were willing to kill Jesus)

Jesus had created a movement, an idea
the day of Pentecost created a church.
