Romans 1-6
The Power of God unto Salvation

GT

Paul's letter to the Romans is yet another parallel between Paul and Alma the younger. Common themes include denunciation of sexual sin, the need for true humility, and God's ~~desires~~ certainty of rewarding us for our deeds. Alma 41:12-15

Gentiles did evil: rejected the clear evidence of God: Romans 1:18-32 led to idolatry
Jews did evil: failed to keep their covenants under the Law of Moses: Romans 2-3

Romans 1-3
Everyone sins, and stands condemned before God without his grace, but the gospel is the power of God unto salvation

Romans 3:21 → inflection point (Alma 36)

Ch. 1 - Gentiles do evil

Ch. 2 - Judgment, hypocrisy & Jews do evil

Ch. 3 - Jews vs. Gentiles? All do evil → we are reconciled through Christ

Ch. 4 - Example of Abraham → we receive God's promise through faith

Ch. 5 - Christ's sacrifice is more than equal to the fall of Adam

Ch. 6 - ~~The~~ saved is to change, become slaves of Righteousness

idezs:

Changing meaning of words
- in the constitution of the U.S.

- the word translated "faith" in the N.T. probably meant "allegiance"

Law = law of Moses
works = acts performed in obedience
→ ergo to the law

grace: Christ's

faith: pistis (Romans 3:3)

- grace was not new in the N.T.

- the Jews had long received disproportionate forgiveness from God through temple ordinances

- Paul explains the temple wasn't the source of this grace (hesed, righteousness, ~~being~~ mercy, loving kindness) "Behold thy mother"
